Can you call them, share baking, share positive factual stories or knitting.




**Do with a bit less**

If you are healthy, it is OK to go outside as long as you keep a safe distance from others.




#### Spread the facts.

<p><b>Stay Home - Stay Healthy Order</b></p> <p><b>UPDATE!</b> →</p>	<p>The <i>Stay Home - Stay Healthy Order</i> was issued by the Governor and came into effect statewide on March 25:</p> <p>“All people in Washington State shall immediately cease leaving their home or place of residence except: (1) to conduct or participate in essential activities, and/or (2) for employment in essential business services.”</p> <p>Proclamation 20-25 (<i>Stay Home - Stay Healthy</i>) is amended to extend all of its provisions and each expiration date therein <b>to 11:59 PM on May 4, 2020</b>.</p> <p>The <i>Stay Home -Stay Healthy Order</i> identifies the following activities as essential activities and which are allowed to engage in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Obtaining necessary supplies and services for family or household members and pets, such as groceries, food and supplies for household consumption and use, supplies and equipment needed to work from home, and products necessary to maintain safety, sanitation and essential maintenance of the home or residence.</li> <li>▪ Engaging in activities essential for the health and safety of family, household members and pets, including things such as seeking medical or behavioral health or emergency services and obtaining medical supplies or medication.</li> <li>▪ Caring for a family member, friend, or pet in another household or residence, and to transport a family member, friend or pet for essential health and safety activities, and to obtain necessary supplies and services.</li> <li>▪ Engaging in outdoor exercise activities, such as walking, hiking, running or biking, but only if appropriate physical distancing practices are used.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Enforcement and Fines</b></p> <p><b>NEW!</b> →</p>	<p><b>Ignorance is no defence!</b></p> <p>Any person willfully violating any provision of an order issued by the governor is <b>guilty of a gross misdemeanor</b>. The maximum punishment for a gross misdemeanor in WA is <b>364 days in county jail</b> and/or a <b>fine of up to \$5,000</b>.</p>
<p><b>Events:</b>  <i>Lehr und Gebet</i>  Communal Meals  <i>Essenschuel</i>  <i>Sonntagschuel</i>  Choir Practices  Funerals  Other Gatherings</p>	<p>All cherished gatherings and events such as communal meals are affected by State orders. <b>Please think about how these are affected.</b></p> <p>Remember, these regulations are meant to be <b>temporary</b>.</p> <p>At greatest risks are those with respiratory illnesses, severe asthma, serious heart conditions, severe obesity, diabetes, and other illnesses that compromise immune systems.</p>
<p><b>Schools and Gym</b></p> <p><b>UPDATE!</b> →</p>	<p>To limit the spread of COVID-19 across communities, all public and private schools are prohibited from conducting in-person educational, recreational, and other K-12 school programs using their school facilities <b>until at least May 4, 2020</b>.</p> <p>While classroom lessons are suspended, it is expected that schools will implement a variety of measures to ensure continued learning for students.</p> <p>For the safety of our children, they should be instructed in physical distancing.</p>
<p><b>Workplace:</b>  Barns and Shops</p>	<p>The <i>Stay Home Order</i> effectively closes all non-essential businesses.</p> <p><b>Agricultural or food-producing businesses</b> are considered essential and remain open.</p> <p><b>Manufacturing</b> that qualifies as critical may remain open. Critical manufacturing has a wide scope and manufacturers should research if they qualify as essential manufacturing.</p> <p><b>Essential businesses are prohibited from operating under this Proclamation unless they establish and implement physical distancing and sanitation measures</b> established by the United States Department of Labor’s Guidance on Preparing Workplaces for COVID-19 and the Washington State Department of Health Workplace and Employer Resources &amp; Recommendations.</p>
